Course Description

English III is a survey course covering the different genres of literature, including novels, drama, poetry, and epics. Intensive grammar study is a key element of the course. In addition to literary studies, students create several small written essays as well as a research paper. Other elements of communication are incorporated into the course of study, including group dynamics, interpreting different media and informational

Assignments/ Grading

Bellwork (the first 10 minutes of class) quizzes will occur weekly. Standards-based assessments will occur periodically throughout the unit and at the end of the unit. Homework may be given at the teacher's discretion and depending on the student's work in class. Grading scale:

80% formal- tests, quizzes,writing assignments, projects 20% informal- daily work, homework.

*Note: Any assignment can and may be counted twice!

Exemption Policy

A student will receive an exam exemption if he/she meets one of the following criteria for a semester-long course:

- A average and not more than 4 attendance events;
- B average and not more than 3 attendance events;
- C average and not more than 2 attendance events.

Students who register after the 5th day of a semester are not eligible for final exam exemptions.

Any student who qualifies for an exemption has the option to take the final exam. By choosing to take the final exam, the exam score will count as 15% of the final semester average for the student. Once the decision has been made to take the final, the student cannot back out of that decision.
